SUMMER 2017

Last night, Lynne McNamee, Mary Beth Coffey, Sue Davies and Carol and Mike Hopkins met to start the process of choosing the company to undertake the 2017 pool remodel.

Lynne gathered three bids and the "fun" began! They were not apples to apples, so much of the meeting was organizing the bids to be sure they were comparative. One bid was around \$80,000 and the second bid was around \$140,000. The group worried about such a disparity between the two. Lynne assigned duties to the committee to find out why the costs were so varied.



The committee will email our findings to Lynne and we will meet again to get closer to a presentable bid.

Lynne was quite clear that there are very few pool companies in Oregon and we need to choose and get on their schedule for Spring of 2017.

We currently have set aside about \$108,000 in our Reserves for this work and will have more by 2017, so the committee feels confident that we can pay for this remodel out of out existing budget with minor modifications.

Thank you Lynne for you continued efforts on our behalf.
