POOL UPDATE

The Pool Committee met with a contractor from Superior Fence and Phil, from Crown Pool and Spa (they are doing the remodel) on February 21st. We will get an estimate for the new fence and gate that will be installed next to the club house and another estimate from Oregon Machine and Fabrication.

The rest of the plumbing has been extended into the pump room - these are lines from the spa and pool. Next week we will get dates for repair of spa jets, removal/repair of additional electrical box that was found during the dig, and then pouring of concrete.

We are putting in approximately 20 landscape lights inside and outside the fence and they will all be placed at

ground level - no light near the top of the pump room.

As you can see from the photo, not as much was done in February due to the abundance of rain, and we can't do much about weather.

This winter has been exceptional with the snow, ice and now rain! With a little bit of luck from Mother Nature we should see concrete being poured the third week of March.

Saturday, April 29, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.



MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

At the January Board meeting, Rudmar was awarded two proposals to help keep our property looking well maintained. The first, (\$1,680.00) is to clean around carports, garages and recycling areas. This has not been done for a long time.

The second proposal, (\$1,000.00) is touch up paint issues. If you have any touch up painting needs, please call Daniel to be put on the list. This project will begin in May.

Believe it or not, Spring is just around the corner! April is usually thought of as Spring Cleaning month. Consider it a chance to clean out dead plants, wash up deck pots, clean up deck furniture and remove items that really shouldn't "live" on the deck anyway! It doesn't take much effort to have your deck refreshed and ready for Spring 2017.

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

The committee met this month to discuss priorities for bringing our infrastructure up to date. Many ideas were brought to the table ... for instance: new irrigation system from the ground up, one zone at a time; removal of trees as allowed by the Forest Management section of the City; soil amendment; mulch covered with bark chips; small groupings of annuals for pops of color; proactive shrub replacement around the perimeter of the complex.
