

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### UP ON THE HOUSETOPS ..

Over the past week we had JR Construction check 80% of our attics for leaks, microbial evidence, squirrel nesting and more.

We received very positive results. The attics were built to 1992 building codes and are in pretty good shape. With that said, construction techniques have improved over the years and OPV may want to consider upgrades over time.

There is microbial evidence and this is easily remediated by spraying in the space. (Please note: NOT all mold is Black Mold. No Black Mold was found during this inspection!)

Because of the pattern of sound construction found in the attics, it was not necessary to check each attic. We saw at least two attics in every building.

We will contact each unit owner as/ when we move forward with either the spraying or upgrading of vents. This cost will be borne by the HOA and will probably be done in a phased manner. This topic will be discussed in the June 7th Board Meeting.
