What should our "theme" be for next summer?





DID YOU KNOW?

At the last Board meeting, we had a presentation for setting up a website for interactive use in finding a neighbor's address or phone number or email address. (Thanks Tom Jackson for your presentation!) This idea was of interest to some attendees, but ONLY if each Owner wants to share their information. There was concern over hacking of information, unsolicited email or unwanted phone calls.

But did you know OPV **has** a web presence on CMI's website? All Owners are welcome to use it's features. For example .. Member Directory! Every Owner can opt in and share their information. Or not. We have about 60 Owners who have already logged in.

This is also a good place to find past meeting minutes, previous monthly Newsletters, etc.

YEAR ROUND SPA

The Board voted to keep the spa open until December 31! We need enough volunteers for chemical checking to meet State and County requirements. If the costs are reasonable and we have enough regular users, this could be a year round amenity for OPV.

JB took the time to analyze known costs to operate the spa. Crown Pools will do a check on the spa when he tests the pool, so no extra cost there. The County will require a year round permit rather than seasonal, an added cost of \$100 per year. Our gas bill is the same monthly amount summer AND winter, so it's hard to say how much the gas will go up in the winter while heating clubhouse and the spa.
