HANDS ON THE WHEEL

Effective October 1, House Bill 2597 goes into effect making using a mobile device by the driver of a vehicle ILLEGAL. Both hands must be on the steering wheel. In 2016, 495 people died on Oregon's roads due to distracted driving, up 58 percent in three years, according to the Oregon Department of Transportation.

You can, of course, mount your device and make an occasional swipe to use GPS or music play lists. Distracted driving is causing more and more accidents ... not to mention traffic delays. If you are stopped at a red light, or in gridlock, you won't be safe from the fine.

The fines are large. Busted once, you can take a distracted driver course to get it off your record. Busted twice in ten years, it's a max fine of \$2,000. A third time, it'll be a minimum fine of \$2,000 and possibly jail time.
