BABY IT'S COLD OUTSIDE!

Over the past two months Mike Hopkins and Kevin Diamond have been working together to learn about our aging HVAC machinery in the Clubhouse. After extensive investigation, they have discovered that our main equipment is fine but our condensers are about 15 years past their life expectancy!

Together they talked to professionals for advice. The consensus is that we keep our machinery but replace the outside CONDENSERS only. The cost is approximately \$28,500. All but about two hundred dollars will be covered by our Reserve funding.

A representative from Watts Heating and Cooling came to the meeting and explain how they will replace our existing units. The units are still chugging along but could quit at any moment. We need to upgrade them before we hit a hot or cold period and they go completely out.

Mike and Kevin, thank you so much for such intensive and complete work and for keeping such a sharp pencil with the cost.

SAD NEWS FOR OUR NEIGHBORS, BILL & PAT:

As many of you know, our long time and good neighbors, Bill and Pat McDonald (and Mary Ann) suffered the loss of their 12 year old grandson, Will. He stayed with his grandparents, here at Oswego Pointe, on multiple occasions. During his short life you may have seen him on his scooter darting around our parking lot or at Foothills Park. On this past Christmas Eve, without warning, Will inexplicably slipped into a coma. He was life flighted to the Children's Hospital in Aurora, Colorado. There was extensive brain damage and his condition was determined, medically, to be irreversible. After 18 days he was declared "brain dead" by the doctors. His life support was withdrawn and on Jan. 10 he entered into Heaven.

The cause is still not known. Pat and Bill drove to Lafayette, where Will and his family reside, to support their son Joey, his wife Diana and their teen daughters Ava and Ella. They will remain in Colorado through mid February. One positive thing we can add is that Will's family chose to let Will be a donor. Eight children have been given life or a better life because of this incredible gift.

Pat also talked about the mark that Will left on his community in such a short life span. There has been a community wide recognition of his passing at his school, in his community and at his church. Their Will was quite the boy, it seems.

Upon the McDonald's return, neighbor friends will hold a small, evening "Cake and Coffee" in the Fireplace Room. (Time and date information will be emailed to our community.) The family has requested a donation to the programs listed below instead of flowers.

This non-profit organization facilitates the donation and recovery of organs and tissues; they serve Colorado and most of Wyoming. The McDonald family worked with Donor Alliance to donate Will's organs and was very comforted by their professional and compassionate approach.
