### **BABY IT'S COLD OUTSIDE**

### **POOL CHEMICAL CHECKERS**

## The pool will open Saturday May 26th for Memorial Day weekend fun.

As you know, we rely on pool users to help check on the chemicals to keep our pool costs down.

You are NOT responsible to add chemicals to the pool, you just take two simple readings and write them on a prepared chart for "Phil The Pool Guy" to review.

If you use the pool...please take at least 6 days over the Summer to check the chemicals. (One day just isn't worth it, as you need to be trained and that takes your one day!!!) We will show you how to do it...It's VERY SIMPLE and it takes about a total of 10 minutes to get the job done. You can do it anytime of the day or night and people can be in the pool when you do it.

Phil, The Pool Guy, checks chemicals and equipment, and cleans the pool 3 days a week for \$75 per day. We need to check chemicals the days he's not here. I hope you see why it is important for us to help care for our pool. IF YOU ENJOY THE POOL...PLEASE SHARE IN THE UPKEEP WITH ALL OF US! Please call MB (503-740-6937) to sign up for your days. Most people like to choose one day, say Tuesday and do it every Tuesday for one month! It's easier to remember! We could have as many as 17 weeks to cover so we need lots of us to pitch in. (If you need to miss your day, we can cover for you!)

POOL SET UP WORK DAY....MAY 26TH 10:00 AM. TREATS WILL BE SERVED! "Many hands make light work!"

OPV IS LOOKING FOR SOMEONE TO ACT AS POOL MANAGER FOR THE SUMMER MONTHS. You will be asked to check the Pool Checker schedule a few times a week to be sure that the chemicals are being checked. You may be asked to do a few other simple tasks during the pool season. Please consider taking on this job for the summer. Again, if you use and enjoy the pool, please step up and help!

### THE SPA IS CLOSED

We are installing new controllers in both the pool and spa this spring. The cost is close to \$16,000. These last about seven years and ours are about twelve years old! "Phil the Pool Guy" will install these as soon as they arrive. He would rather do it now and not have to close the pool/spa during Summer!
