### **DECKS**

The deck resurfacing has been going along very nicely! The men working on our decks have been very, very polite and professional. Most of our neighbors have been too!!!!!

We will be done with the resurfacing by the middle of August. After that, the painters will return, and power wash our railings and sand and repaint any of the black safety rails that need it. They will then sand, prime and paint the front edge the decks.

When they power wash the railings, you will need to move your deck items back from the rails about 4 feet. (This applies to both up and down stair units.) (They could not do it when they repainted the deck surfaces as it takes too long for the decks dry.)

I know that this has been challenge for some neighbors. But we hope that the improvement will be worth it to you all.

We want to especially thank the Stocks and the Creightons for their help during the extended time that they had to be out of their units.


It's a fun casual evening. Last year we served 70 plates of ribs. PUT IT ON YOUR CALENDAR NOW! It's always a very good time!
