LIGHTS OUT?

HVAC

Over 25 condo units were represented at the Ductless HVAC meeting. The speakers were very informative and helpful. The device was running during the entire presentation and it could hardly be heard. It is very quiet. Every person at the presentation was impressed at the lack of noise, the neatness of the outside units and their compact size.

Our declaration documents state that if any equipment is to sit on common property (outside of the units/ visible by others) we must have an agreement of 75% of owners that they agree that these units can sit on common property. They do NOT need to purchase the HVAC, just 75% of owners must agree that the units may be placed on common property. The Board has already given permission to move forward with gathering information to present to homeowners.

More information is being put together and we will be sending it to all owners as soon as we get it ready. This project, if it moves forward, will not start until Spring.

NORTHWEST NATURAL GAS

Susan Spring has taken a considerable amount of her time to work with NNG about bringing gas to our units for the fireplace and the hot water heater. There is only a minimal cost to get the gas to each building. (Gas stoves are not on the program at this time.) If you want gas to come to your unit and to change your Fireplace and or Water Heater...you pay for the new appliances, pipes for the gas to your unit and the monthly gas bill. In the past we have been told that the price was too high to even consider bringing the gas line to our units. Times have changed!

At least twenty (20) Owners must sign up to convert to gas or it can't happen. This is a condition from NNG. No ROI for them with less folks. At least 75% of Owners must agree to house the meters on common property. This idea will be presented to the board at the November meeting.

WE NEED YOU

The POOL CLOSING PARTY will be held Sunday, October 7th at 2:00. We will be steam cleaning the furniture and putting it and most of the patio furniture away for the winter. We would like to keep the Spa open as long as possible. But that requires people to check the chems. four (4) days per week. We do have new controllers in the pump room, so we may have better luck keeping the chem levels where they need to be this fall. Please come to the work party and sign up for Chem Checking this fall, especially if you use the pool and spa. We will be covering the pool this year.
