GREETINGS FROM BRIGHTVIEW LANDSCAPE SERVICE TEAM

We leave behind another long hot and dry summer and look forward to weather fitting of an Oregon fall. With the cooling weather, turf and plant growth will slow.

- Next week mowing schedule shifts to every other week mowing. Your yearly care schedule reflects three mowing visits in October two in November and one in December. Crews may not mow some turf areas should they be excessively wet at the time of their visit. They will attempt to mow these spaces on the following mow visit should conditions have improved.
- Lawn fertilization is scheduled to be completed before the end of October.
- Leaf cleanup is scheduled to be undertaken once in October, twice in November and December, and then one more good clean up again in January. The leaf crew will focus on the areas of major leaf drop focusing on collecting the bulk of the leaves on the ground. As we move toward Christmas, the majority of the trees should be bare by this time, and our efforts will focus on gathering some of the last leaves within the community. Please be aware that despite our best efforts at cleaning up the majority of the leaves, the drop will continue and foul some of the good work the crew completes.
- Winterization of the irrigation system will be undertaken through November. All irrigation clocks should all be turned off by now.

The budget meeting went smoothly. The board was in agreement on almost every vote.

We have had a lot of expensive projects over the last few months and we have a few ahead of us. Two decks were totally replaced, all of the decks were recoated and painted. Four buildings will have their attics redone in 2019. (Dryer Vents given their own dedicated vents with hard wiring, checked for mold and cleaned if necessary.) three stairway structures were rebuilt, all buildings will have existing downspouts removed and commercial grade downspouts installed. Extensive tree trimming will begin late this fall (branches over the carports) and of course the usual number of trees will be removed. Curb cleaning will start very soon.

We took \$200,000 out of the Contingency Fund and moved it to future Reserve Funds keeping our dues from skyrocketing over the next few years. We want to thank CMI for their extensive input on our budget this year. Thanks Tom.

Dues will increase 2% starting in January 2019.
