PARKING AT OPV

You may have noticed that parking at Oswego Pointe Village Condos is at a premium. We thought it would be a good time to remind all of us of our parking guidelines.

PLEASE do not park in front of the Pool and the Clubhouse. Even though we do not have signs (yet), these spaces are for VISITORS ONLY.

Please use your ASSIGNED CARPORT for your first car or other licensed vehicle. Many of our households have more than one driver and therefore have more than one vehicle. Your second vehicle must use an uncovered spot. Don't leave your carport empty and occupy an uncovered spot. If you have difficulty using your carport, please contact a Board member so we can brainstorm a solution.



In consideration of parking ease, we do ask that large, oversized trucks park at the northeast part of our complex, facing the outside perimeter. We sometimes have residents who cannot even open their car doors to get in and out.

If you need to park your work/corporate vehicle here, and it is oversized, please contact the Board for prior approval.

All vehicles in our parking lot must have a current license plates and be in usable condition. Please register your car or vehicle with Judy Rossner, (503) 699-8731, head of Building Captains. If you notice a vehicle that appears to be unused or abandoned, please let Judy, or CMI, or any Board member know.

Only vehicles owned by residents, or their guests (WHILE visiting), may park on our property. Any questions or concerns? Contact a Board Member.
