

Happy Birthday Parade for Linda Dadson! She has fun friends!




We have not scheduled the next board meeting due to coronavirus precautions.


Please know that a permit is necessary to put in a water heater and a plumber is the right person to do this job. The price is generally around \$1,150.00 plus.

DRIP, DRIP, DRIP

We all have new commercial grade downspouts installed on our units. Most of us love them but they can seem loud to some of us. Most people get used to the noise and don't even hear it in about a week. Please give it some time. If the drip still bothers you, you can put a net shower "scrunchie" in the bottom of the pipe and the noise should soften. If you do this, you need to pull the scrunchie out and let the collected debris out of the pipe. We are waiting for a better solution from the installation company.

FOR THE LAST TIME

Your patio and or deck is considered "limited use" property. This means that it "semi" belongs to you and you may decorate within the Condo Living Guide rules. The decks may not be used as a storage space, a pace to store wood or fuel and should only contain things that are normally found on a common deck.

The ground in front of or beside your patio is considered "Common" property which means that it belongs to all of the neighbors. This part of the community is under the strict direction of the Landscape Committee and finally the Board, if and when necessary.

Please look at the common property nearest to you. If you have more than four or five decorative items in this area, you may not be in compliance. Also, if you want to add plants, flowers, garden items or make any additions or changes to that area, you must draw a plan defining your intentions and get permission from the Landscape committee to make these changes. Every Owner may join the committee. Just come to the meeting. (Renters may attend the meetings, but they may not vote.)



Of course, the Landscape Queen's flowers would be beautiful!
