#### WELCOME TO VACATION STAYS AT OPV

Most of you know that we have a three-room Guest Suite on our property. Many of you have rented it for family visits but it might be new to some of you. Below are some of the basic rules for renting the suite:

Only Owners may rent the unit and for a period of up to two (2) weeks. (Longer stays are available under specific situations like home remodel or health recuperation.) On Site Renters who want to use the Suite may work through MBC to rent the unit.)

The suite is \$50 per night and Owners will be sent a paper bill. (On Site Renters will pay cash to MBC.)

The folks staying in the suite must be direct family, friend, relatives of the renter. NO renting for friends of friends. The suite is an amenity for our Owners, not a hotel.

The Owner/renter must be on property when their guests are staying in the suite. Dogs are allowed but may NEVER BE LEFT IN THE UNIT ALONE. NEVER!!!!!! An adult must be present in the suite overnight. No overnight slumber parties for minors.

You must bring your own sheets and towels. There are sheets available for use, but they must be washed and returned to the suite within three days of use.

The suite must be left as it was found, meaning do a basic clean up after use. The HOA will deep clean the suite after each stay. During COVID, we are required to open a window between each stay. We are still following this protocol.

We do not operate as a hotel. We do not clean daily. If the rooms are overly dirty or disorganized, we may post additional charges to the Owner. (This has only happened three times in 20 years. Most people are careful in the suite.)

The rooms heat and cool quickly. Please turn heat down when you go away for the day. (It is expensive to hear and cool "empty"rooms.) All guests are allowed use of the Clubhouse, spa, and pool. (Same rules apply to Guest Suite Guests as to Owners.)

The rooms are booked first come first served. Please do not "hog" the holidays If you booked the suite one year for Thanksgiving or Christmas, let others have a chance at it. (I keep a second list of requests for rooms, and I will call you if your date becomes available from a cancellation.) Please cancel as soon as possible. Most dates, summer especially, are very popular.

The HOA raises from \$6,000 to \$10,000 per year from this amenity. Please treat like you would your very own Guest House. The vast majority of our Owners do a wonderful job of caring for the suite and we appreciate your efforts. Here's to a very busy Guest Suite Summer...it's already booked, booked, BOOKED!
