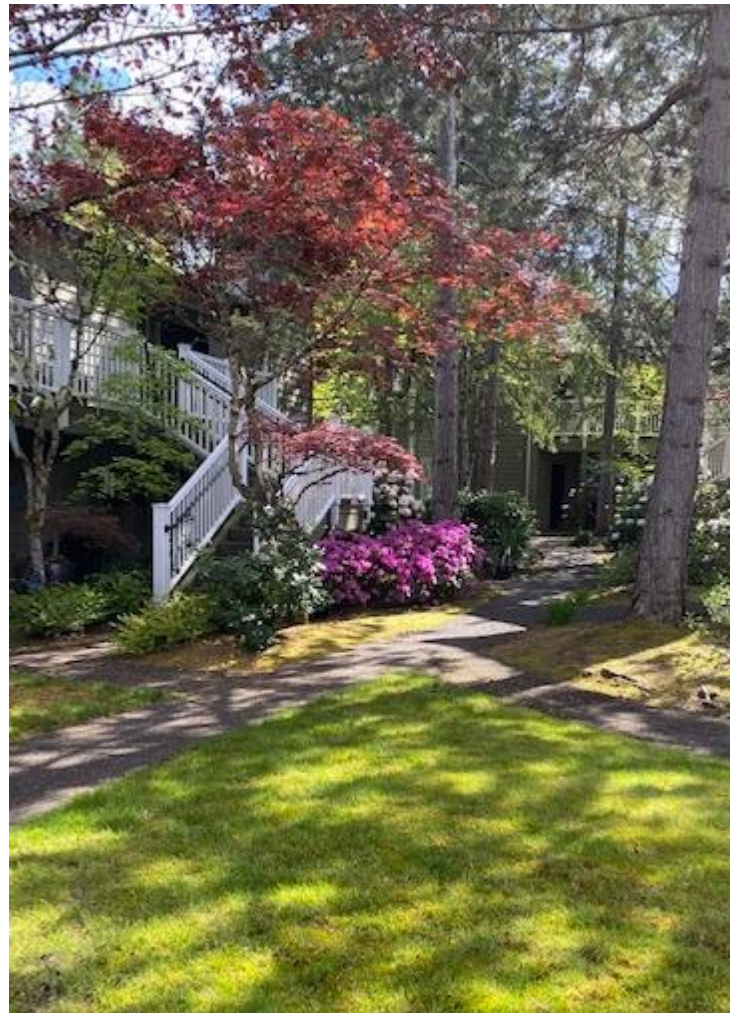
I try very hard to let everyone have as much freedom with their flowers as possible. But there needs to be an overall plan (and look) to our beautiful community.
