

POOL OPENING

The pool and spa are open. Folks have already been using the pool!

We have had to work around roofing, repairing the Fireside Room and installing an electric heat pump, for the pool.

We will not be replacing the solar panels because of expense, maintenance, damage to the roof, cost and investment recoverability.

The new heat pump heats the pool in less than 48 hours and the heat is constant. The downside is that they are a bit noisy. We will set ours to power down at night and come back on in the morning. It will be a learning curve for the first few days...so keep us in the loop if you have sound issues.



A few reminders:

- You must be 14 to be alone at the pool. No running...no jumping...no horseplay.
- No glass containers.
- No animals in the pool enclosure.
- Check the pool hours. The hours are posted on the gate.
- All guests MUST be accompanied by an OPV resident. (AT ALL TIMES.)
- If you bring a family group, please be considerate of others in the pool. It is not your personal playground!
- Pool floats are getting bigger and bigger.
 Be sure that there is room for others if your floats are in the pool!
- Please clean up after yourselves.

WHEN YOU LEAVE, PUT YOUR FURNITURE BACK WHERE YOU FOUND IT. PUT YOUR TABLE UMBRELLA DOWN WHEN YOU LEAVE. TAKE ALL OF YOUR ITEMS WITH YOU. WASH YOUR TABLES DOWN WHEN YOU LEAVE. This area belongs to all of us. Please be responsible.

POOL CHEMICAL CHECKERS

It costs OPV \$100 daily to check the spa and pool chemicals. For this reason, we have neighbors help with this task.

It is easy to lean, quick to do, and saves us a ton of money on pool maintenance!

YOU ONLY NEED TO MEASURE THE CHEMICALS AND WRITE IT DOWN ON A CHART. YOU DO NOT NEED TO TOUCH OR ADD CHEMICALS TO THE POOL OR SPA.

It is best to sign us for the same day every week so that you remember to do it! Many of us pair up with a pal and take turns every other week. Sandy and I (MB) are the "Sunday Gals" all summer and we swap with each other when necessary. It's fun and we always have a backup.

PLEASE, IF YOU USE THE POOL, BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR AND HELP WITH THE CHEMICALS! IF WE DON'T GET ENOUGH FOLKS TO HELP CHECK THE WATER, WE MAY HAVE TO CLOSE DOWN ON CERTAIN DAYS.
